

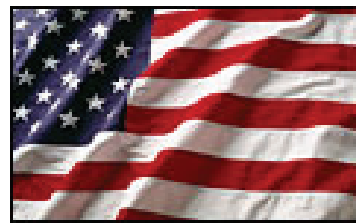


## WHEN WE GIVE TO ALBANY PRESBYTERY'S MISSION WE MAKE THINGS HAPPEN!
